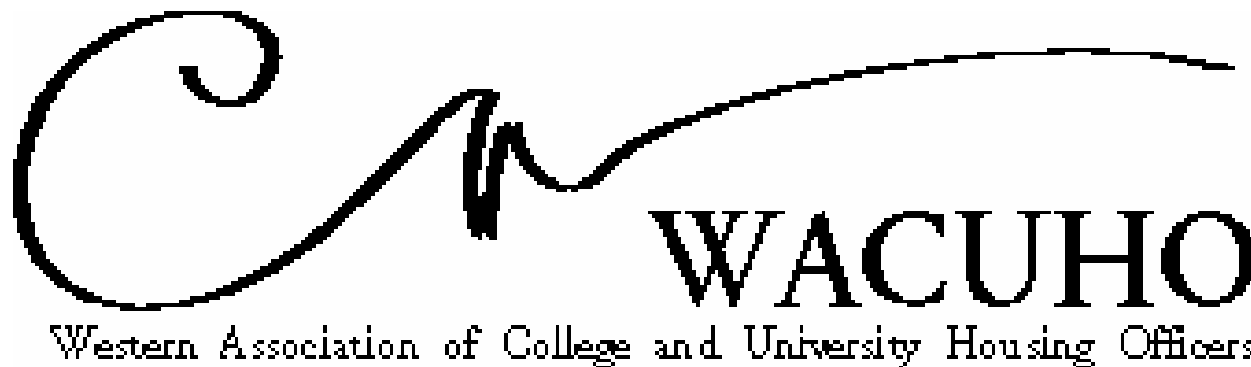

The Transformative Mediation Training

Hosted by
University of California, Santa Barbara
May 16—18 and May 19, 2006

UCSB is collaborating with the Institute for the Study of Conflict Transformation to offer a top-quality training in transformative mediation, a cutting edge approach to mediation. The transformative framework was first articulated by Robert A. Baruch Bush and Joseph P. Folger in *The Promise of Mediation* in 1994. Since then, transformative theory and practice has grown and is used in mediation, facilitation, and conflict management training all over the world. Robert Baruch Bush will be one of the key speakers/facilitators in this training, so participants will have the opportunity to learn from one of the founders of this work.

The transformative framework is relevant for many types of conflict intervention processes, including interpersonal, small group, and organizational applications. This is a powerful training for anyone involved in any kind of work that requires any mediation of conflict.

In the transformative view, conflict is primarily about human interaction rather than "violations of rights" or "conflicts of interest". Conflict is part of the basic dynamic of human interaction in which people struggle to balance concern for self with connections to others. When this balance is upset, human interaction becomes alienated and destructive. Simply put, there is a crisis in human interaction. ACUHO-I 2006 Spring Board Meeting

The ACUHO-I Executive Board met February 8th through 11th in Columbus, Ohio. Here is a breakdown of our key discussion points from the meeting.

- The Board has reduced the number of times it physically meets in order to reduce expenses. Concurrently, monthly conference call meetings were instituted to keep business of the Association moving promptly.
- Invitations will be extended to NZATEAP (New Zealand Association of Tertiary Education Accommodation Professionals) and RLPA (Residence Life Professional Association) to affiliate with ACUHO-I. Both organizations have formally requested such action. We are excited about the continued expansion of ACUHO-I. We are also planning for continued discussion of the regional affiliation agreements.
- To move the ACUHO-I certification program forward, a new position as Director of Education was authorized. This position will provide support and leadership for intentional strengthening of professional development for the membership.
- ACUHO-I will partner with NASPA (National Association of Student Personnel Administrators), ACPA (American College Personnel Association), and ACUI (Association of College Unions International) to provide an international study tour to either Australia or Asia.
- In an effort to provide greater offerings at our conferences and workshops, the Executive Board has authorized the establishment of guidelines to partner with other associations to bring in presenters with specialized expertise that is of value to our members, and to pay stipends for presenters with information that might not be available to us without financial support.
- ACUHO-I has committed to supporting the student affairs archive at Bowling Green State University where ACUHO-I's materials are archived.
- We are investigating the cost of translation programs to offer ACUHO-I materials in other languages.
- Substantial progress has been made on improving budgeting processes which allows us to determine real costs and accountability.
- Jazz It Up will be a tremendous event this fall, bringing the expertise of all five ACUHO-I workshops together in Jacksonville, FL.
- The Awards and Recognitions Committee are seeking nominations for ACUHO-I Awards. Please consider nominating other colleagues and sending those to Eddie Hull at Duke University.
- The year marks the 30th anniversary of the ACUHO-I Internship Program.
