President's Letter

Greetings WACUHO!

Here we are again—days away from our annual conference (the 52nd WACUHO Annual Conference to be exact) and things are falling beautifully into place. The Annual Conference Chair, Ramona Hernandez, along with the annual conference committee chairs, have done a wonderful job preparing an amazing assortment of programs for the association at the Hyatt Regency in Sacramento!

Despite the excitement surrounding this year's annual conference, I find myself thinking about the past 51 years of history that have brought us to this point. In reviewing the mission and purpose of WACUHO that the founding leaders of our association crafted as a framework to guide future generations, it is clear that all of the components within a housing program (residence halls, apartments, food service, administrative services, conferences, facilities, etc.) were to be the primary focus of our organization. If we extrapolate to include marketing and information technology as administrative services, the founding ideas seem to have withstood a half century of time fairly well.

This year's Annual Conference Programming Committee deserves many kudos for spending so much time and energy on intentionally soliciting program topics that address as many of the functional areas outlined in our mission. The committee has gone as far as creating "golden nugget" categories to ensure a wider array of program topics.

However, similar, to past years, the majority of program submissions are from members of the Residential Life/Education functional area; therefore, the topics are geared more to a residential life/education audience. Without more involvement from the other functional areas, it is easy to understand how some of our association members might perceive that the primary focus of the WACUHO Annual Conference is supposed to be Residential Life/Education.

I applaud this year's Programming Committee for taking steps to change this perception and I can only hope that future Annual Conference committees will do the same if that is still the desire of our association. I do believe that if WACUHO is to be a representation of all housing functional areas, we will all need to make an effort to represent our own functional area via program proposals, committee involvement and/or vying for an elected/appointed position on the Executive Committee.

I realize that there are many possibilities for the decreased involvement from areas outside of Residential Life/Education. It is possible that some of the functional areas within our housing programs have found outlets that are more suitable for their needs and WACUHO is no longer the primary source for professional development/involvement. For instance the natural alignment between ACCED/Conferences; APPA/Facilities; WACUBO/Administrative Services; NACUFS/Food Service and the list goes on and on. However, this does not mean that WACUHO is no longer able to represent the needs all of the functional areas within a housing program. Again, that will all depend on the association's commitment to the current mission/goals of our organization.

The Executive Committee is aware of the perception that currently exists and we are planning to commission a short-term taskforce to study the overall purpose of WACUHO and forward a recommendation regarding the future direction of our association. I believe that this taskforce will provide insight into the matter and allow us to examine whether the mission and/or goals of our association have shifted over the course of the past 50 years.

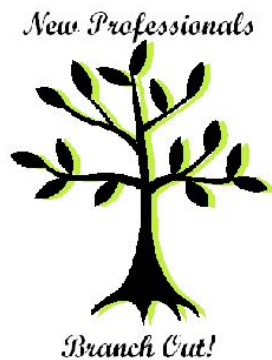
Annual Conference Placement Exchange


WACUHO's 5th Annual Case Study Competition

Major Donors

On Campus Marketing and Collegiate Marketing were both recognized as Major Donors to the Foundation. Their continued commitment to ACUHO-I and the student housing profession is greatly appreciated.

Budget and Finance Updates

The Board is pleased to note that the Foundation has received an unqualified audit for both 2005 and 2006. In addition, the Finance and Investment Committee presented a budget for 2008 that covers all operations, fundraising activities, and programs for the foundation as well as contributing \$227,000 to the Association to support their strategic initiatives. This budget will necessitate the beginning of an aggressive fund raising campaign.

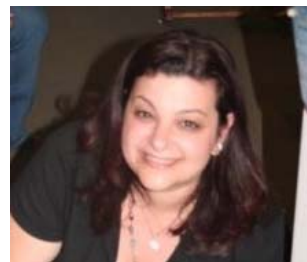

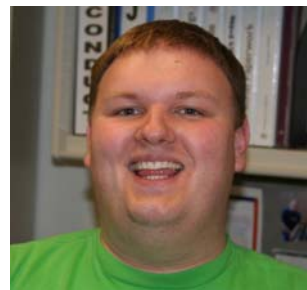
